

Braswell Foods SWI Crackless Egg® Purchase Recommendation

The need for the constant use of a Crackless Egg® at our layer facilities has presented the need to upgrade our device. Our current device works, but the original design has been replaced by a much better one. The technology in the handheld devices has progressed rapidly thus allowing for more accurate impact detection by causing fewer processing glitches and freezes caused by the PDA. The SWI program itself is also included on a separate memory card used by the PDA that can be easily installed if a complete battery discharge occurs (the internal memory is erased in the event of a prolonged battery discharge).

The wireless transmission design has been improved by utilizing a separate receiver that can be worn on the belt, but also increases the sensitivity in comparison to the older “sled” type receivers. The benefit of these two improvements results in a greater reliability and accuracy as compared to the older device. Time spent uploading and deleting files (on the PDA) is greatly reduced due to the hardware in the PDA. What use to take minutes to delete or transfer, now takes seconds.

The computer based software is also light years beyond the previous version. The new version, called Agent QC, enables the user to manipulate the views, insert event tags based on time, export data to spreadsheets (which can be emailed to managers), paste images of the graphs into documents, and much more. The ability to do anything with the data is a vast improvement from the previous software. These improvements increase productivity by allowing the individual quick access to spreadsheets designed to analyze the data and increase accuracy by allowing the user to view actual values versus overall graphs.

After reviewing this product, I recommend we strongly consider purchasing the upgrade.
